CRDB invests 3bn/- in micro-finance institutions

IN a move to reduce poverty in Tanzania, the CRDB bank has invested a total of Tshs 3bn in micro finance institutions programmes in four regions.

According to the bank's Managing Director, Dr.Charles Kimei, the institutions are located in Morogoro, Dodoma, Iringa, and Mbeya regions.

He said last week in Dar es Salaam that, the programme involves micro- finance institutions most of which are Savings and Credit Cooperative Societies (SACCOS) established by workers, businessmen and farmers.

Last year was the second year for the programme, and the bank has managed to enter into partnership with 22 microfinance institutions.

He said the bank has been collaborating with DANIDA in implementing the

programme, and has disbursed 2bn/- in credit bonds issued to the microfinance institutions.

He explained that through the programme, the bank has managed to train 38 personnel employed by 22 microfinance institutions, and conducted training programmes for more than 500 people.

"Our long term target is to see that small farmers, food vendors, and petty traders benefit from the programme, and eventually open up accounts with our bank", he said.

He explained that last year the bank recorded a higher number of deposits than any other bank in the country. Deposits grew by 26 per cent from 164bn/- in the year 2000 to 201bn/- last year he noted.

Last year, the bank recorded a profit of 2.7bn/-, which would enable it to pay dividends of 10 per cent to its shareholders.
